Mosquito Control

Mosquitos are a concern for homeowners this time of year. We are happy to report that the City of Tampa has also been doing aerial spraying at night for mosquitoes. The last time that South Tampa area was sprayed, was about 10 days ago. Below are a couple tips for keeping your place mosquito free:

- Eliminate standing water in low spots, ditches, gutters and similar areas.
- Empty receptacles that collect water (e.g. bird baths and pot plant saucers).
- The Colony Oaks retention pond has been checked for mosquito larvae and we can confirm that there are none are present due to the tiny fish in the pond are eating them.
- Window and door screens should be 16-18 size mesh and fit snugly, without gaps around the edges. Check your screens for holes and repair or replace them as needed.
- Replace your outdoor lights with yellow "bug" lights. These lights do not repel insects, but mosquitoes and other pests are less likely to find them attractive and invade your yard.
- Use of some other repellent products, such as citronella candles and mosquito coils, may also be effective if used in windless conditions.

Trash Talk

A quick reminder on proper dumpster etiquette:

- Trash should be in garbage bags and tied up.
- Break down boxes. Fully assembled boxes can fill a dumpster quickly.
- Don't block the dumpster, City of Tampa will only try once to remedy the situation and then move on
- These are residential dumpsters -- No Furniture, No Construction Materials, and No Paint Containers.
- If you need to dispose of those items take it to the City Dump yourself or hire someone to do it for you.
- Use the recycle bins for glass, plastic, and newspapers.
- Do not leave garbage outside the dumpster. If it's not in the dumpster, it doesn't get picked up.
- There is no one to pick-up after anyone, please make sure the garbage gets in the dumpster.
